Pursuant to Cir. Ct. R. 19, Plaintiffs, through their Counsel, Carl M. Varady and Thomas R. Grande, and Defendants, through their Counsel, Attorney General Anne E. Lopez, Deputy Attorney General Craig Y. Iha, and Special Deputy Attorneys General Linda Lee K. Farm and Donna H. Kalama, hereby stipulate:

WHEREAS, the parties have entered into a settlement intended to achieve a full and final resolution on a class-wide basis of all claims that have been asserted and could have been asserted in this matter (the “Settlement”) and have executed a Settlement Agreement to effectuate those terms (the “Agreement”);

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2022, the Court entered its *Order Adopting Findings and Recommendations of the Special Master to Amend the Schedule for Final Approval Hearing [Filed November 22, 2022]*(the “Scheduling Order”)[Dkt. 1568], setting forth the form of approved notices and certain deadlines for notices to Class Members and setting deadlines from them to correct data or opt out of the lawsuit;

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2023, the Court entered its *Stipulation to Amend Timetable*

Of Events Contained In Exhibit 9 To December 5, 2022, Order Adopting Findings and Recommendations of the Special Master to Amend the Schedule for Final Approval Hearing [Filed November 22, 2022][Dkt. 1568] and Order [Dkt. 1606] (the “Order Amending Schedule”) amending the Scheduling Order and setting April 3, 2023, as the new deadline for class members to correct data or opt out of the lawsuit (Exhibit 1 hereto);

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2023, the Court approved the *Stipulation to Provide Corrective Notice of “No Claim” and Amend Timetable for Correction and Opting out Contained in Exhibit 2 to Stipulation to Amend Timetable of Events Contained in Exhibit 9 to December 5, 2022, Order Adopting Findings and Recommendations of the Special Master to Amend the Schedule for Final Approval Hearing [Filed November 22, 2022][Dkt. 1568] and Order (Filed January 23, 2023)[Dkt. 1602]; Exhibits 1-3 [DKT. 1638]*, extending the time period for notices of “no claim” and the deadline for Class Members receiving new notices of “no claim” to object to the notice or opt out (the “New No Claim Order”);

WHEREAS, the April 11, 2023, New No Claim Order approved sending a “no claim” notice to an individual class member in the form attached hereto as Exhibit 2, to provide a reasonable correction and opt out period for Class Members with recently discovered “no claim” data to receive, review and correct their data or opt out;

WHEREAS, the no claim notice attached as Exhibit 2 was sent by the Claims Administrator to five individual Class Members on April 18, 2023;

WHEREAS, the deadline for those five Class Members to object to the “no claim” determination or to opt out was June 1, 2023, and said deadline remains in effect;

WHEREAS, the Claims Administrator has characterized the data integration process as one of the “most complex” it has ever had to complete;

WHEREAS, the data integration process for claims is nearing completion but not yet

complete due to the complexity of the data;

WHEREAS, the time required to obtain complete and accurate data regarding Class Members' lease application and award dates has been extensive, is complex, and the time necessary to complete the review of the more than 4,000 claims presented in this case has been substantial;

WHEREAS, since the Second Notices were mailed out on January 31, 2023, the data review and correction has been an ongoing process;

WHEREAS, after the New No Claim Order was entered by the Court, the ongoing data review and correction process has led to the discovery of additional Class Members who have no claims and cannot receive payments under the terms of the Settlement Agreement;

WHEREAS, a notice of "no claim" must be provided to these additional Class Members who have no claim (the "second new no claim group");

WHEREAS, the parties seek to provide the second new no claim group, i.e., the Class Members whose "no claim" status was discovered in the correction and review process taking place after the New No Claim Order, sufficient time to receive, review and correct their data or opt out, while preserving other deadlines, including the Final Approval Hearing;

WHEREAS, the proposed "no claim" notice for the second new no claim group, in the form attached as Exhibit 3, explains the correction process, and includes a June 30, 2023, deadline to mail corrected data or object to the notice, and a July 6, 2023 deadline to opt out, while maintaining the July 6, 2023, deadline to object the Settlement Agreement as a whole, but otherwise is identical to Exhibit 2, the previously approved no claim notice;

WHEREAS, the proposed extension will not affect the currently-scheduled mailing of the Third Notice the week of June 13, 2023, or the date for the Final Approval Hearing, July 21, 2023;

WHEREAS, this stipulation and proposed “no claim” notice were submitted to the Special Master for review, comment, recommendation, and approval prior to their submission to the Court, as evidenced by his signature below;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree that the second new no claim group, i.e., Class Members discovered to have no claim during the review and correction process will receive the new “No Claim” Notice set forth in Exhibit 3 hereto and the Amended Timetable for Class Members with “no claim” discovered after the April 11, 2023, New No Claim Order, will be modified as set forth in Exhibit 4:

Lopez, Deputy Attorney General Craig Y. Iha, and Special Deputy Attorneys General Linda Lee K. Farm and Donna H. Kalama, hereby stipulate:

WHEREAS, the parties have entered into a settlement intended to achieve a full and final resolution on a class-wide basis of all claims that have been asserted and could have been asserted in this matter (the “Settlement”) and have executed a Settlement Agreement to effectuate those terms (the “Agreement”);

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2022, the Court entered its *Order Adopting Findings And Recommendations Of The Special Master To Amend The Schedule For Final Approval Hearing [Filed November 22, 2022]*(the “Scheduling Order”)[Dkt. 1568];

WHEREAS, the Scheduling Order includes a timetable for mailed notice to the Plaintiff Class (Exhibit 1)(the “Current Timetable”);

WHEREAS, the time required to obtain complete and accurate data regarding class members’ lease application and award dates has been extended, is complex, and the time necessary to complete the review of the more than 4,000 claims presented in this case has been substantial;

WHEREAS, on November 30, 2022, the principal file review for Class Members was completed, and data transmitted to the Claims Administrator for integration into its existing

Class Member database;

WHEREAS, the Claims Administrator has characterized the data integration process as one of the “most complex” it has ever had to complete;

WHEREAS, other than for the Class Members who settled or opted out, the data integration process for claims is not yet complete due to the complexity of the data;

WHEREAS, on January 13 and again on January 19, 2023, the Claims Administrator disclosed it is unable to complete the data integration process for the Class Members who have not settled or opted out;

WHEREAS, the Current Timetable approved in the Court’s December 5, 2022, Scheduling Order [Filed November 22, 2022][Dkt. 1568] required the Second Notice to be mailed the week of January 16, 2023;

WHEREAS, the Claims Administrator has represented that it has completed the mailing of the Second Notice to the Class Members who have settled or opted out during the week of January 16, 2023;

WHEREAS, the Claims Administrator cannot complete the mailing of the Second Notice to the Class Members who have not settled or opted out under the Current Timetable set in the Scheduling Order;

WHEREAS, the Claims Administrator requested a two-week delay from the week of January 16, 2023, to January 31, 2023, to mail the Second Notice to the Class Members who have not settled or opted out;

WHEREAS, to preserve the 60-day review and opt out period for Class Members to receive, review and correct their claim data, or opt out, after the Second Notice is mailed, the Claims Administrator has been directed by the Special Master to extend the period for such

review, correction, and opting out from March 17, until and including April 3, 2023, and to accept corrections and opt outs post-marked up to and including April 3, 2023;

WHEREAS, the Claims Administrator has confirmed the proposed extension will not affect the currently-scheduled mailing of the Third Notice the week of June 6, 2023, or the date for the Final Approval Hearing, July 21, 2023;

WHEREAS, the publication and mailed notices contained in Exhibits 2-5 approved by the Court in its *Order Adopting First Amended Findings and Recommendations of the Special Master to Approve Proposed Settlement Distribution Plan and Revised Class Notices (Filed December 22, 2022)*; *Revised Exhibits 1-6 [Dkt. 1580]*[Filed January 5, 2023][Dkt. 1589], will be revised to include the new April 3, 2023, deadline to correct data or opt out of the lawsuit, but otherwise remain unchanged;
